


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

THE DIOCESE OF INDIANAPOLIS

The Diocese of Indianapolis

The Diocese of Vincennes (now Indianapolis) was established by decree of Gregory XVI, May 6, 1834, and the See was fixed at Vincennes. The territory then comprised the entire State of Indiana and the eastern part of Illinois. The latter was separated from the Diocese of Vincennes by the erection of the Diocese of Chicago, November 28, 1843.

By a decree of Pius IX, January 8, 1857, the northern half of the State was erected into the Diocese of Fort Wayne, the boundaries being that part of the State north of the south lines of Fountain, Montgomery, Boone, Hamilton, Madison, Delaware, Randolph, and Warren Counties. The southern half of the State remained the Diocese of Vincennes. It embraces fifty counties in Indiana, covering 18,479 square miles, with a population, according to U. S. Census of 1930, of 1,619,079. It extends from the north line of Marion County and contiguous counties to the Ohio River, and from Illinois on the west to Ohio on the east.

The second Bishop of Vincennes, by Apostolic Brief, was permitted to establish his residence either at Vincennes Madison, Lafayette or Indianapolis; the See city, however, to remain at Vincennes. This permission was renewed to the fourth Bishop, with the exception of Lafayette.

On the appointment of the fifth Bishop, he was directed to fix his residence at Indianapolis, but the Cathedral and title of the See were continued at Vincennes. By an Apostolic Brief dated March 23, 1898, the title of the Diocese was changed to that of "Diocese of Indianapolis," with the Episcopal See in the city of Indianapolis. By the same Brief the Patron Saint of the Diocese is to remain St. Francis Xavier, the title of the old Cathedral, Vincennes.

BISHOPS OF THE DIOCESE

I. Most Reverend Simon Gabriel Brute, D. D., born in Rennes, France, March 20, 1779. Ordained priest in Rennes June 10, 1808. Consecrated Bishop of Vincennes in the Cathedral at St. Louis, Mo., October 28, 1834, by the Most Reverend Benedict Joseph Flaget, D. D., Bishop of Bardstown, assisted by Most Reverend Joseph Rosati, D. D., Bishop of St. Louis, Mo., and Most Reverend John Baptist Purcell, D. D., Bishop of Cincinnati. Bishop Brute died at Vincennes June 26, 1839. The remains are interred in the old Cathedral, Vincennes.

II. Most Reverend Celestine de la Hailandiere, D. D., born in Combourg, Diocese of Rennes, May 3, 1798. Ordained priest in Paris, May 28, 1825, Vicar General of the Diocese of Vincennes, 1836. Named Bishop Coadjutor of Vincennes, May 17, 1839. Consecrated in Paris, August 18, 1839, by Most Reverend Charles Forbin-Janson, D. D., Bishop of Nancy, assisted by Most Reverend Louis Blanquart De Bailleuil, D.D., Bishop of Versailles, and Rt. Rev. John Louis le Mercier, D. D., Bishop of Beauvais. Resigned July 16, 1847, and returned to France. Died May 1, 1882, in France. The remains were brought from France and interred in the old Cathedral, Vincennes.

III. Most Reverend John Stephen Bazin, D. D., born in Duerne, Diocese of Lyons, France, October 15, 1796. Ordained priest at Lyons, July 22, 1822. Came to the United States in 1830 and was Vicar General of Mobile. Consecrated Bishop of Vincennes, in the Cathedral of Vincennes, October 24, 1847, by Most Reverend Michael Portier, D. D., Bishop of Mobile, assisted by Most Reverend John Baptist Purcell, Bishop of Cincinnati, and Most Reverend Celestine de la Hailandiere, former Bishop of Vincennes. Died at Vincennes April 23, 1848. Remains interred in the old Cathedral, Vincennes.

IV. Most Reverend Maurice de St. Palais, D. D., born at La Salvetat, France, November 15, 1811. Ordained priest in Paris, May 28, 1836, and came immediately to the United States. Administrator of the diocese after the death of Bishop Bazin. Nominated Bishop of Vincennes, October 3, 1848; consecrated in the Cathedral, Vincennes, January 14, 1849, by Most Reverend Richard Pius Miles, O. P., D. D., Bishop of Nashville, assisted by Most Reverend Martin John Spalding, D. D., Coadjutor Bishop of Louisville, and Very Reverend Hippolytus Dupontavice, Vicar General. Died at St. Mary-of-the-Woods, June 28, 1877. His remains were interred in the old Cathedral, Vincennes.

V. Most Reverend Silas Marean Chatard, D. D., born in Baltimore, Md., December 13, 1834. Alumnus of the Urban College, Rome, where he was ordained priest, June 14, 1862, by Cardinal Patrizzi. Was Vice Rector of the American College, Rome, 1862-1868; Rector, 1868-1878. Named Bishop of Vincennes, March 26, 1878, at which time he took the name Francis Silas. Consecrated in Rome, May 12, 1878, by Cardinal Franchi, assisted by Mgr. Santori, Bishop of Fano, Italy, and Bishop Agnette, President of the Academia Ecclesiastica at Rome. Enthroned in the Cathedral, Vincennes, August 11, 1878. Arrived in Indianapolis, August 17, 1878. Died at Indianapolis, September 7, 1918. His remains were interred in the Cathedral, Indianapolis.

VI. Most Reverend Joseph Chartrand, D. D., born in St. Louis, Mo., May 11, 1870. Ordained priest in Indianapolis, September 24, 1892, by Bishop Chatard. Appointed Vicar General, February 13, 1910. Named Bishop of Flavias, and Coadjutor to the Bishop of Indianapolis, July 27,

1910. Consecrated in the Cathedral at Indianapolis, September 15, 1910, by Most Reverend Diomede Falconio, D. D., Apostolic Delegate, assisted by Most Reverend D. O'Donaghue, D. D., Bishop of Louisville, and Most Reverend Herman Alerding, D. D., Bishop of Fort Wayne. Bishop of Indianapolis, September 7, 1918. Assistant at the Pontifical Throne, February 4, 1928. Died at Indianapolis, December 8, 1933. His remains were interred in the Cathedral, Indianapolis.

VII. Most Reverend Joseph Elmer Ritter, D. D., born in New Albany, Indiana, July 20, 1892. Alumnus of St. Meinrad Minor Seminary and St. Meinrad Major Seminary. Ordained priest in St. Meinrad Abbey Church, May 30, 1917. Named Rector of the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul, Indianapolis, in 1924. Appointed Titular Bishop of Hippus and Auxiliary Bishop to the Most Reverend Joseph Chartrand, Bishop of Indianapolis, February 3, 1933. Consecrated in the Cathedral at Indianapolis by the Most Reverend Joseph Chartrand, assisted by the Most Reverend Emmanuel Ledvina, Bishop of Corpus Christi, Texas, and the Most Reverend Alphonse J. Smith, D. D., Bishop of Nashville, Tennessee. Made Vicar General of the Diocese of Indianapolis February 5, 1933, Bishop of Indianapolis, March 26, 1934.

From the Diocese of Indianapolis have gone the following priests as bishops:

1. The Most Reverend Augustus M. Martin, D. D., born in Rennes, France, in 1803. Ordained in Rennes in 1828. Came to the United States with Bishop Hailandiere in 1839, and was made Vicar General of the Diocese. In 1847 he went to New Orleans, and in 1852 was Vicar General of that Diocese. He was consecrated Bishop of Natchitoches, La., November 30, 1853, by Archbishop Blanc, of New Orleans, assisted by Bishop Portier, of Mobile, and Bishop Van de Velde, of Natchez. He died September 29, 1875.

2. Most Reverend Martin Marty, O. S. B., D. D., born in Switzerland, January 11, 1834. Ordained priest in Einsiedeln September 14, 1856. Made first Abbot of St. Meinrad in 1871. Consecrated titular Bishop of Tiberias, and Vicar Apostolic of Dakota Territory at Ferdinand, Ind., February 1, 1880, by Bishop Chatard, assisted by Bishop Seidenbusch of St. Cloud, and Abbot Innocent Wolf, O. S. B., of Atchison, Kans. Made Bishop of Sioux Falls, 1889. Transferred to St. Cloud, January 21, 1895. Died September 19, 1896, at St. Cloud, Minn.

3. Most Reverend Denis O'Donaghue, D. D., born in Daviess County, Indiana, November 30, 1848. Ordained at Indianapolis by Bishop St. Palais, September 6, 1874. Chancellor of the Diocese from 1878 to 1899. Vicar General March 19, 1899. February 13, 1900, named Bishop of Pomario and Auxiliary to the Bishop of Indianapolis. Consecrated in St. John's Church, Indianapolis, April 25, 1900, by Archbishop Elder, of Cincinnati, assisted by Bishop Foley, of Detroit, and Bishop Byrne, of Nashville. Named Bishop of Louisville February 9, 1910. Enthroned in the Cathedral at Louisville, March 29, 1910. Died November 7, 1925, at Louisville, Ky.

4. Most Reverend Herman Alerding, D. D., born in Ibbenbueren, Diocese of Munster, Germany, April 13, 1845. Ordained priest by Bishop

St. Palais, at St. Meinrad, September 22, 1868. Named Bishop of Fort Wayne, August 30, 1900. Consecrated in the Cathedral of Fort Wayne, November 30, 1900, by Archbishop Elder, assisted by Bishop O'Donaghue, Auxiliary of Indianapolis, and Bishop Moeller, of Columbus. Died December 6, 1924, at Fort Wayne, Ind.

5. Most Reverend Emmanuel B. Ledvina D. D., born in Evansville, Ind., October 28, 1868. Ordained priest at Indianapolis, March 18, 1893. Assistant at Holy Trinity Church, Evansville, until September 1, 1894. Assistant St. John's, Indianapolis, until July 20, 1895. Rector of St. Joseph's Church, Princeton, until September 8, 1907. September 9, 1907, became Secretary of the Catholic Church Extension Society at Chicago, and later Vice-President. June 18, 1918, appointed Domestic Prelate. April 30, 1921, Bishop-elect of Corpus Christi, Texas. Consecrated at St. Mary-of-the-Woods, Ind., June 14, 1921.

6. Most Reverend Alphonse John Smith, D. D., born in Madison, Ind., November 14, 1883. Ordained in Rome April 18, 1908. Assistant at the Cathedral from June, 1908, until 1920. Established the parish of St. Joan of Arc, Indianapolis. Church dedicated July 15, 1920. At the Secret Consistory, December 23, 1923, made Bishop-elect of Nashville, Tenn. Consecrated Bishop of Nashville March 25, 1924, in the Cathedral of Indianapolis, by the Most Reverend Joseph Chartrand, D. D., Bishop of Indianapolis, assisted by the Most Reverend Emmanuel B. Ledvina, D. D., Bishop of Corpus Christi, and Most Reverend Samuel Stritch, D. D., Bishop of Toledo.

7. Most Reverend James Hugh Ryan, S. T. D., Ph. D., Titular Bishop of Modra, was born in Indianapolis, December 15, 1886. Alumnus of The College of the Holy Ghost, Pittsburgh, Pa., and the Pontifical College of the Propaganda and the Academy of St. Thomas in Rome. Appointed Chaplain and Professor of Philosophy at St. Mary-of-the-Woods, Indiana, March 11, 1911. Secretary of the Educational Department of the N. C. W. C. at Washington, June 15, 1921. Honored with the title and rights of Domestic Prelate by His Holiness, Pope Pius XI, September 10, 1927. Rector Magnificus of the Catholic University of America by His Holiness, Pope Pius XI, July 12, 1928. Honored with the title of Prothonotary Apostolic, August 5, 1929. Appointed Titular Bishop of Modra, August 15, 1933. Consecrated October 25, 1933, in the shrine of the Immaculate Conception Washington, D. C., by the Most Reverend Joseph Chartrand, D. D., Bishop of Indianapolis, assisted by the Most Reverend Thomas Molloy, Bishop of Brooklyn, N. Y., and the Most Reverend Joseph Elmer Ritter, D. D., Titular Bishop of Hippus and Auxiliary Bishop to the Most Reverend Joseph Chartrand, D. D., Bishop of Indianapolis.

NOTE: The Most Reverend Henry Moeller, D. D., late Archbishop of Cincinnati, though not a priest of the Diocese of Vincennes, acted as Secretary of Bishop Chatard at St. John's Church, Indianapolis, during the year 1880, until recalled to Cincinnati to become Chancellor of the Archdiocese.

The Most Reverend Vincent Wehrle, O. S. B., D. D., Bishop of Bismarck, North Dakota, was for a time assistant priest at Jasper.

The Most Reverend J. Henry Tiernan, D. D., Titular Bishop of Bosana, was born at Oldenburg, Indiana.

The Most Reverend Albert Daeger, O. F. M., D. D., late Archbishop of Santa Fe, is a native of St. Ann's, Jennings County, Ind., and was for a time at Oldenburg.

The Rt. Reverend Columban Thius, O. S. B., Abbot of St. Joseph's Abbey, St. Benedict, La., was Rector of the Major Seminary, St. Meinrad Indiana.



2. An Annual Report of the Parish is to be sent to the Chancery, in duplicate, each year before February 1. This report is to be signed by the Reverend Pastor and the Parish Counsellors. The report is to be of the Calendar Year, that is, from January 1 to December 31. After being examined by the Auditor in the Chancery the Report is filed in the Chancery, and the Duplicate is returned to the Reverend Pastor to be filed in the Parish Archives.

3. Deeds and Abstracts of church property are to be deposited in the Chancery.

4. Every priest of the Diocese should have his last will and testament drawn up in legal form and a copy of same sealed and deposited in the Chancery Archives.

5. On the occasion of the transfer of a priest from one parish to another, the outgoing Rector shall deliver to his successor, either in person or through the Dean of the District, the registers and account books of the Parish, together with Insurance Policies and other valuable papers of the parish.

Occasione institutionis novi Rectoris elenchus hujusmodi a Rectore locum cedente tradatur Decano Districtus, qui novo Rectori illum praesentabit." (Synod Vinc, IV, 1886, Tit. II No. 3.)

6. An excerpt is given here from the letter of the Most Reverend, the Bishop of the Diocese, which was addressed to the Reverend Pastors, July 25, 1935:

"... the Bishop of the Diocese with the approval of the Diocesan Board of Administration, hereby promulgates the following regulations:

"First—A strict accounting of all money received and expended must be kept in a proper set of books by the Reverend Pastor or Administrator. (Canon 1523, No. 5). If the Pastor chooses, he may do this through the help of a lay person. In all such cases we recommend that this person be a man. Failure to maintain proper financial records is indication sufficient of incompetency in parish administration, and is adequate cause for the removal of any Pastor neglectful in this important matter. (Can. 2147, No. 5; Can. 2157; Can. 2404, 2406).

"Second—Before any new buildings or major improvements be undertaken in any parish, even before an architect is employed, permission must be obtained by the Reverend Pastor from the Chancery in writing.

"Third—A major improvement is any improvement where the expenditure entailed, exceeds two percent of the gross income of the parish.

"Fourth—Every Reverend Pastor and Administrator must make an annual report to the faithful of his parish. This is not to be confused with the CHANCERY REPORT. Let the report of the Reverend Pastor be printed or mimeographed in sufficient number for distribution in the parish. This report should be a true and honest statement of the parish receipts and expenditures. If there is a parish debt have a statement of this fact in your parish report also."

These regulations shall become effective at once:

At the time of the change of the administration of a Parish, the outgoing Rector shall add the receipts of the current year to the balance on hand January 1 of that same year, and from this total shall deduct the disbursements of the current year. The balance on hand, together with the receipts and the vouchers for payments made, shall be handed over to the new Rector, who will give his signature and receipt therefor. If there be a deficit, the new Rector will give the retiring Rector a note or due bill covering the amount of the deficit. The account books are then to be continued for the fiscal year, regardless of the change in administration. In case of disagreement, the matter is to be referred to the Chancery with a full and complete statement of the difficulties.

The Pastor in charge of a Parish at the close of the fiscal year (December 31) is required to give an account in the Annual Report made to both Chancery and parish for the entire fiscal year (January 1

to December 31), and not merely from the time he takes charge. There must be therefore a complete understanding between the new Rector and the one retiring at the time of the change in the administration of the Parish.

7. "The Forty Hours Devotion shall be celebrated each year, with the greatest possible solemnity in all parochial and other churches where the Blessed Sacrament is habitually preserved, on the days fixed with the consent of the local Ordinary." (Canon 1275).

DIOCESAN TRIBUNAL

1. The Reverend Pastors and Administrators are obliged by their office to see to it that the faithful in their care are well instructed on the matter pertinent to the married state, as well as the legislation of the Church on this Sacrament. A well prepared instruction on these matters might profitably be given each year at the Lenten Season.

2. Petitions for special faculties and dispensations in all matrimonial cases of revalidation are to be addressed to the "Chancery Office, Attention, The Very Reverend Officialis." This officer of the Diocesan Tribunal will refer the case to the Most Reverend, the Bishop of the Diocese or to the tribunal of Pro-Synodal Judges. Consequent decision or instructions will be forwarded to the parties under excommunication.

3. Petitions for dispensations in either Mixed Religion or Disparity of Cult will be accepted for consideration only when the Cautiones are signed and enclosed with the petition. Furthermore the Reverend Pastor must add his recommendation, stating that he is morally certain of the sincerity of the petitioners who have signed the Cautiones. He will also give a canonical reason for the granting the dispensation.

The taxa required by the Sacred Congregation of the Sacraments is to be enclosed or a reason given why the offering cannot be sent.

When dispensation from the banns is sought by the prospective bride and groom, a grave and serious reason must be presented for the dispensation.

The taxa received for these dispensations are given over to the Seminary Fund of the Diocese.

2. Pastors and Administrators may obtain the privilege of omitting the reading of the Passion in the second Mass on Palm Sunday (\$2.50 S. C. R.)

3. Permission may be granted for the use of incense in the Missa Cantata on feasts of doubles of the second class and higher. (\$2.50 S. C. R.)

4. The Holy Oils may be obtained at the Chancery on Thursday of Holy Week, the day on which they are consecrated. An offering is to be made by each Reverend Pastor and Administrator in person or through their representative when the Holy Oils are obtained.

5. Priests of the Diocese are to request and receive permission in writing when they wish to be absent from their place of duty. It is contrary to the ruling of the Sacred Canons of the Church for a Pastor to be absent from his parish for a week without the express permission of the Most Reverend, the Ordinary of the Diocese. A celebret may be obtained by applying to the Chancery Office.
